






Projects by Year







Population Growth





Residential Units Completed







The number of jobs in LIC grew by 40% between 2011 and 2022 —expanding 2.2x faster than NYC—and has now rebounded to prepandemic levels, highlighting the area's strong economic resilience.


New BID Businesses



LIC BID's storefront vacancy stood at just 7.55% in Q4 2024— significantly lower than the citywide rate of 11.13%—demonstrating the district's strong retail demand.

The LIC BID welcomed 7 new businesses in the first three months of 2025.
